RE: Season Highlights 2005-2006

- UTD ranked third in the country in the Varsity Points rankings of the National Debate Tournament (NDT) during the first week of October 2005. This was and remains the highest ranking ever reached by UTD.
- The Dallas Morning News published a lengthy article profiling the UTD Debate Team on October 23, 2005 (Metro Section, page 3B) due to its strong national ranking. The article highlighted many of the team's recent successes and discussed the dedication that brought the team to its high ranking.
- The debate team finished the season ranked 15th in NDT Varsity Points. This placed the UTD debate team along side some of the country's most respected colleges (please see the list of the Top 50 schools at the end of this document). UTD's high ranking reflects an excellent season with many quality wins over strong teams, such as the Baylor, Dartmouth, Georgetown, Kansas, Iowa, Michigan, Northwestern, Oregon, Rochester, Richmond, Texas-Austin, Trinity and Whitman. Fifteenth is the best end-of-year showing in the (brief) history of the UTD Debate Team.
- UTD Debate won numerous awards from the Cross Examination Debate Association (CEDA):
- A) UTD was named the 2005-2006 South Central Regional Champion. Teams earn points during the season. The South Central Region is extremely strong, and is the home to such powerhouses as the University of Texas and regional rival University of North Texas.
- **B)** Britt Clark, Deer Park senior, was named to the All American Debate Team. Only 32 individual debaters in the nation earned this award, chosen from hundreds of applicants.
- C) Three UTD partnerships reach the top 64 in the nation (Britt Clark & Sara Stephens, Derek Denman & Gaby Stevenson, and Ahmad Abbas & Brandon Garrett) at the CEDA National Championship Tournament. The team of Abbas-Garrett advanced to the top 32, placing them amongst other outstanding teams from Harvard, Kansas, Dartmouth, and Whitman also competing in the round of 32.

• UTD had a rather successful run at the National Debate Tournament (NDT). Northwestern University hosted the 60th Annual National Debate Tournament. The team of Britt Clark and Sara Stephens finished with 4 wins and 4 losses and a total 12 of 24 possible ballots. While that might sound quite average, it is actually a pretty good result. First, it is the NDT so all teams at the competition are quite good. A team that can earn 4 wins at the NDT is an excellent team. Second, it is better than any UTD team has ever done in the past. Third, it means that we finished tied for 35th among the 78 teams at the competition. It is even more impressive when you consider that some teams (Harvard, Dartmouth, etc) qualified three teams for the NDT and had all finish in the top 35. So if you just count the best team from each school then we finished tied for 22nd. Fourth, we finished ahead of every other team from every other college from the state of Texas (Baylor, North Texas, Texas-Austin, Trinity, etc)!

UTD's wins at the NDT came against teams from Wayne State, Texas-Austin, Texas-Austin (yes, we beat two different Longhorn teams, and officially ended a 17 year streak of Texas teams advancing to the elimination rounds), and James Madison. UTD losses were to teams from Southern California, Wake Forest, Oklahoma and Wyoming.

- Chris Burk, Director of Debate, was selected by the Tournament Committee of the National Debate Tournament (NDT) to be one of the seven judges for the Final Round of the 2006 National Debate Tournament. The Finals saw a team from Michigan State defeat a team from Wake Forest on a 6-1 decision to win the national title.
- College Sports Television (CSTV) selected the UTD Debate Team in 2006 to be
 one of the featured teams for its annual documentary on the National Debate
 Tournament (NDT). This dramatic documentary will be presented throughout
 October 2006 on CSTV, a national cable channel recently acquired by CBS. The
 exact date for the program's premier has not yet been announced.
- UTD hosted their third annual intercollegiate debate tournament January 7-9, 2006. The tournament is the largest and most competitive in the region and brings hundreds of students and coaches from all over the country to the UTD campus. Last year, 73 teams from more than 25 schools attended the tournament. Many prestigious teams such as the Cornell, Dartmouth, Kansas, Iowa, Michigan State, Richmond, Wake Forest, and Vermont competed at the tournament. The fourth annual UTD debate tournament will be take place in January, 2007 and again play host to some of the top teams in the country.
- Britt Clark, spring 2006 graduate with a degree in Politics and Government major, had incredible individual successes during the 2005-06 season. In addition to being named to the All American Debate Team, Britt earned second place in the annual Debater of the Year Award presented by Baylor's prestigious Glen R. Capp Debate Forum. By far the most impressive individual achievement for Britt

was being named a Jaworski Scholar by Baylor University. The Jaworski Scholarship honors up to three of the nations most successful student debaters with a scholarship to Baylor University School of Law. This is an immense honor, and a tribute to the hard work and commitment that Britt has displayed throughout his career at UTD.

• The UTD Debate Team continues to show academic as well as competitive success. The overall GPA for active team members is 3.59. This is most impressive considering the massive commitment to research and travel that the debaters carry in addition to their academic load.

Forthcoming Events

- Chris Burk and Scott Herndon will represent the UTD at the International Conference on Argumentation, Rhetoric, Debate and the Pedagogy of Empowerment, 24-26 November 2006, Koper, Slovenia. This is the second time that representatives of the UTD Debate team have attended this international conference.
- The International Debate Academy selected Chris Burk to be a senior instructor
 for its 2006 session held in Ormoz, Slovenia. This week-long annual academy
 brings together college students and faculty from over twenty countries to learn
 about debating and its role in civil society. It is sponsored by "Za in proti" (Pro
 and Con), the national debate organization of Slovenia.
- The 2007 National Debate Tournament will occur at the Westin Park Central Hotel in Dallas. UTD is proud to be joining Harvard University as the primary sponsors of this important event.
