<u>Call to Order</u> The meeting was called to order by committee chair Basheer Benhalim at

8:07 am.

Medical Services Fee Chris Manes discussed his visit to the Health Center. He is very interested in the Health Center having a full time physician which would necessitate the fee to be raised to \$31.19. Beverly Ballard stated that the consulting physician we have now is booked most of the time he is on campus and that other universities comparable in size to UTD have several full time physicians in their health centers. She also stated that receiving subsidy from the Medical Services Fee helped keep the costs down in the health center but is concerned that the fee may not keep up with rising medical costs in the future. Moving the Student Counseling budget would save \$542,448 but would require the Student Services Fee to be increased. Sue Sherbet will work on projected numbers for raising the fee to \$55.00.

Student Union Fee

The Student Union Fee account requires a \$100,000 balance in its reserve. Donna Rogers stated that one option to project savings could be to cut operating hours in the building. Activities did appear to decrease between Spring and Fall. Committee members questioned the need to replace the furniture in the Comet Lounge as it appears to be in good condition. Donna stated that the furniture is now ten years old and that looking in from the windows, the wear on the pieces is not apparent. Another question involved the subscriptions for the building. Donna will bring the breakdown of all subscriptions now currently ordered.

Stella Mulberry addressed requests in the Activities Program budget. She explained various requests in the M & O account and also stated that she has received more requests for co-sponsorships from campus and that more funds were needed to help with those requests. Donna Rogers

explained that Wells Fargo would like to be more involved in student activities and could be providing funds for food for future events.

Recreational Fee

The Recreational Fee budget was not discussed at this meeting.

Student Services Fee

Donna explained that the Athletics budget asked for the rest of its requests per last year's agreement. They had split the costs over two years.

Fund requests for Disability Services are needed to cover the services they are already providing. These services are state mandated for our students.

Mary Kaye Adams presented requests for Learning Resources which included \$18,000 for TSI/THEA expenses that were no longer received from the state as well as replacing outdated office computers.

Dr. Michael Coleman discussed various academic competitions that UTD is involved in. UTD does very well in these competitions and he stated that they had placed third in the Legal Mediation Competition this year. These funds are vital for UTD to continue to build successful competitive teams.

Basheer Benhalim will go to the SGA to discuss the Student Services fee increase. Sue Sherbet will add figures for the fee to go to \$20 and a \$200 cap. The next meeting will be on November 23rd at 8:00.

Call to Order The meeting was called to order by Dr. Darrelene Rachavong at 8:50 am. The Student Fee notebooks were handed out and Dr. Rachavong explained the layout of the books. She also stated that a new fee, Student Services Building Fee, was being considered. This new fee would be used to build and maintain a student services building which would house student services operations currently housed in the McDermott Library. Conference Center, Hoblitzelle Hall and first floor of the Student Union office wing. The first step in the process is for a referendum to be on the ballot in the SGA general election in April. Architects will be on campus December 6th and 7th to come up with a preliminary space plan that would provide square footage. This step is necessary to calculate the cost of the building and the amount of the fee to be proposed.

Medical Services Fee

Dr. Rachavong explained that there was a problem with the Medical Services Fee account in that if every request were approved, there would be a deficit. The fee can be increased to 10% by the committee but the funds generated would still be insufficient. An increase greater than 10% has to be on a ballot in the SGA election in April. Another option is to move the Counseling Center onto the Student Services fee if this fee were raised to a sufficient amount.

Student Union Fee

This fee is at its cap. The only way to raise it is to go to a referendum and to the Regents and Legislature for approval. This fee account needs to have \$100,000 in reserve which makes approval of requests doubtful. Donna Rogers explained that The Pub has surpassed all expectations and therefore the kitchen is in dire need of expansion. The expansion would cost approximately \$100,000 of which \$40,000 could be covered in the current Student Union budget. The Pub's revenue does not cover all its expenses at this time. It may be possible to move SIJAAB or Activities to Student Services Fees if this fee is increased.

Donna will be sending The Pub's annual report and budget to committee members for review.

Recreational Students voted in a referendum to increase this fee to \$64 in Fall 06.

If all requests for this fee were approved it would put this account Services Fee in deficit. The Student Service Fee can be raised by 10% with committee

approval. The cap can be raised from \$150 up to \$250 with majority

approval from SGA.

Committee Action

Basheer Benhalim was voted as chair of this committee. It was decided to meet again on November 9th at 8:00.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:40 a.m.
