I am happy to inform you that the clinical doctoral degree program in audiology at the University of Texas, Dallas has been granted accreditation by the Council on Academic Accreditation of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. This accreditation is for an eight year period beginning October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2015.

Annual reports will be reviewed by the Council to assure that your program maintains compliance with the requirements for accredited programs and will be due October 1, 2008 for the next six consecutive years. On the seventh anniversary of your accreditation period, you will be asked to submit an application for re-accreditation to allow the Council on Academic Accreditation a year to complete its processing before your accreditation expires.
