**Statement**

My academic career in its early stages focused on electoral behavior, voting and the dynamics of elections. My first publications, as well as my dissertation, examined various topics relating to voting and elections, including the role that economic conditions play in voting and elections. Later, my interests shifted toward more of a policy focus: i.e. “What explains policy stability and change?” and “To what extent do elections as well as other forces such as technological change impact policy change?” This has resulted in numerous publications including the publication in 1998 co-authored with Brian Berry and colleagues, The Rhythm of American Politics. Other articles have been focused on various specific policy issues, including environmental policy, affirmative action and the like. Some of this research also explores the determinants of public attitudes for particular policies and programs.

A concurrent research track has been dedicated to the examination of the role of nonlinear dynamics and what is typically referred to as complex adaptive systems research. The research has produced two books including the well received Chaos Theory in the Social Sciences (1996) co-edited with L. Douglas Kiel as well as a National Academy of Sciences Colloquium that I helped organize acting with Brian Berry and L. Douglas Kiel. The CV below lists various other publications in that area. Generally, my research has always tended to focus on the dynamics of change in political issues, economic processes and the particular consequences of that change.
