Research Interests

In line with the goals and objectives of the School of Economic, Political, and Policy Sciences (EPPS) and the Criminology Program, my research agenda is centered on issues related to interpersonal violence and public policy. I have conducted original empirical investigations and summary works on violence as it relates to neuropsychological correlates of violence, life-course perspectives of crime, mental health, child abuse, domestic violence, gender and crime, parricide, capital punishment, youth crime, and other forms of aggression, delinquency, and deviance. My publications provide critical discussion of key public policy implications relevant to criminological, social, and legal circles while utilizing various methodologies, theoretical models, and methods of analyses.
