Research Interests My research aims to map and understand the ecology of complex networks in the arts and humanities. By studying large structured datasets and integrating expertise from a variety of fields, such as the multidisciplinary science of complex networks, traditional arts and humanities, digital humanities, and information design, I strive to answer a number of fundamental questions: How can we comprehensively characterize the complex structure, dynamics and evolution of the available document record in the arts and humanities? What are the fundamental limits in reconstructing the actual historic process – i.e. the historian's equivalent of prediction? How do these limits depend on the complex nature of actual historic processes, massively heterogeneous preservation, hard to measure document bias, or the cognitive limits of individual scholars?

Key objectives are (a) to open hidden areas of inquiry by empirically measuring and visualizing implicit network dimensions, (b) to understand the macroscopic shapes of time in the historic process as they emerge from granular data, and (c) to build a community of practice and to communicate the results to a broad audience.

Fulfilling these objectives will break new ground. Results will facilitate both exploration and understanding of arts and humanities data for experts as well as non-experts. Results will also help to establish the emerging data science of arts and humanities, while adding a missing aspect to complex network research by amending the established list of physics, computer science, biology, social science, and economics. My research relies on a vigorous application of quantitative hermeneutics.
