RESEARCH INTERESTS

My work looks at how we create identity, and in particular maternal identity, through storytelling. My photographs map the new and constantly changing terrains of mothering using a toy film camera with a plastic lens. By combining elements of documentary and art photography, my work becomes a form of creative nonfiction, and moves beyond a statement of fact to an invitation to the viewer to engage in meaning creation with the artist and the subject. The images reference family narratives in photo albums and home movies, and create maternal identity through the stories being told. My photographs voice my lived experience in a way that empowers me and links my experiences to those of other mothers who document their own families. In sharing these images, together we create theories of motherhood.
