The most notable recent performance of this 21-member brass ensemble was at UT Dallas' Inauguration Ceremony for President Benson in October of 2016. Other recent performances include music by Leroy Anderson, such as *Bugler's Holiday*, and Victor Ewald's *Brass Quintet No. 1*. Typical repertoire studied and performed by this ensemble include both standard literature written for brass quintet, and literature written for larger brass ensembles.

This applied music class will study the history, interpretation, and performance practice of brass chamber music. As is the nature of chamber music, students will play brass repertoire in small groups performing in a variety of genres. Typical repertoire will include works by composers such as Gabrieli, J.S. Bach, Ewald, Calvert, and Sousa. The course will culminate with one or more public performances.

From Mozart to Model T's: A study of music and its role in society from the Classical period through the early twentieth century The course studied significant composers and musical works from the Classical period through the early twentieth century with an emphasis on the reciprocal relationships between music and society in the Western world. While examining the musical works of composers such as Mozart, Haydn, Beethoven, Mendelssohn, Liszt, Wagner, Verdi, Brahms, R. Strauss, Mahler, Tchaikovsky, Dvorak, Sousa and others, various aspects of society including political ideologies and events, philosophies, art movements and technological advances were considered. Numerous topics, including the Napoleonic Wars, Realism, Nationalism, Romanticism, commerce, transportation and the Industrial Revolution, were discussed as they pertained to composer lifestyles and stylistic changes in musical compositions.
