PURPOSE:

To establish a Crime Prevention and Community Policing policy that will foster a formal relationship with the community to increase the community's understanding of the activities and role of the Police Department

POLICY:

It is the policy of the Police Department for the Crime Prevention Unit to assess issues of the community and respond to them before they become a problem. The response may be in the form of crime prevention programs, a public forum or flyers.

PROCEDURE:

- I. Crime Prevention Function:
 - A. The Crime Prevention Officer, whether civilian or commissioned, is directly responsible for;
 - 1. developing public understanding of the consequences of crime, awareness of police service needs, and the police role in society;
 - 2. promoting citizen participation in the prevention of crime and apprehension of criminals through the Campus Crime Watch and other crime prevention programs; providing a means of citizen input into the services offered by the Department;
 - distribute and assess crime prevention and service surveys on an annual basis, during the Spring term for future program needs; and
 - 4. ordering, dispensing and controlling police uniform equipment and supplies, and office supplies;
 - B. Community Relations Liaison Officer(s) are responsible for maintaining communication with their assigned community group, including;
 - 1. meetings
 - 2. special event activities
 - 3. crime prevention program referrals

- III. Community Relations
 - A. Community Relations function is to;
 - 1. Establish liaison with formal community organizations such as;
 - a. Student Government
 - b Residential Life
 - c. Black Student Association
 - c. Greek life
 - d. Athletics
 - e. Faculty and Staff Councils
 - 2. This responsibility is not exclusive to assigned liaison officers, it is to be the objective of every member of the Department.
 - 3. Feedback from the community will be presented to the Crime Prevention Officer who will review it with the Chief for actions or implementations.
 - B. Community Relations Program Reviews
 - 1. The Crime Prevention Officer is responsible for preparing and submitting a report, at the end of the Fall and Spring terms which includes;
 - a. a description of current concerns voiced by the community
 - b. a description of potential problems that have a bearing on law enforcement activities within the community; and
 - c. a statement of recommended actions that address previously identified concerns and problems.
 - 2. A survey of the community's opinions is conducted during every Spring term with respect to:
 - a. overall agency performance;
 - b. overall competence of agency employees;
 - c. officers' attitudes and behavior towards citizens
 - d. recommendations and suggestions for improvements
