WHY UTD?

Welcome to The University of Texas at Dallas, a dynamic research institution on the cutting edge of science, technology, medicine, business, policy sciences, and the arts.

UTD fosters a strong tradition of academic excellence. It became part of the U.T. System in 1969, offered only graduate degrees until 1975, and admitted its first freshman class in 1990. Today, UTD offers 41 undergraduate degrees and 78 graduate degrees. It is host to seven schools, offers an array of interdisciplinary degree programs, and features a student population as diverse as its areas of study.

With a current enrollment of more than 14,000 students and a world-class faculty that includes two Nobel laureates, UTD aims to provide Texas and the nation with the benefits of educational and research programs of the highest quality. By merging theory with practice in classrooms and at the university's 29 research centers, curious minds are challenged to find the answers to their questions.

Unique apartment-style housing on campus is available to all students, including freshmen. In short, UTD provides a quality education and a wealth of opportunities to anyone striving to reach their potential.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AT UTD

Academic Excellence Scholarships (AES)

All admitted freshmen are considered for an AES.

Academic Recognition Scholarship

- \$1,000 per semester
- Renewable for four years/eight semesters

Academic Distinction Scholarship

- Covers all costs of tuition and mandatory fees
- \$1,000 per year contribution toward Waterview Park Apartment rental expenses
- Renewable for four years/eight semesters

Academic Honors Scholarship

- Covers all costs of tuition and mandatory fees
- \$1,000 per year contribution toward Waterview Park Apartment rental expenses
- \$1,500 cash award per semester towards books, supplies, and other educational expenses
- Renewable for four years/eight semesters

Academic Excellence Scholarships for National Merit Scholars

- Must be admitted to UTD, must list UTD as first choice
- Covers all costs of tuition and mandatory fees
- \$1,000 per year contribution toward Waterview Park Apartment rental expenses
- \$2,500 cash award per semester towards books, supplies, and other educational expenses
- Renewable for four years/eight semesters

Federal Financial Aid

The mission of our Financial Aid Office is to help remove financial barriers and assist students with the cost of attendance at The University of Texas at Dallas. We strive to provide you with the federal, state, and institutional financial assistance that you are eligible to receive to pursue your educational objectives at UTD. The application period for federal financial aid begins January 1 of each year for the following academic year (fall, spring, and summer). The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. You may obtain the FAFSA packet from your high school guidance counselor or by contacting the Financial Aid Office at UTD.

HOW TO APPLY TO UTD

High school graduates applying to UTD for the fall semester are considered freshmen regardless of the number of college hours previously earned.

To apply, submit:

- Completed State of Texas Common Application
Apply online at www.applytexas.org
- Official high school transcript in a sealed envelope from every high school attended
- Essay Topic C on the Texas Common Application
- Official SAT I or ACT scores posted from the testing agency or on the official high school transcript
- \$50.00 non-refundable application fee (make check or money order payable to The University of Texas at Dallas)
- International students: submit official report of TOEFL score
