



Accounting and Information Management

The Accounting and Information Management programs provide students with educational opportunities that balance conceptual and pragmatic learning and expose accounting students to related business areas.

The programs strive to develop professionals who understand the role of information in organizations and financial markets, possess analytical and management skills and can integrate financial analysis and information technology.

Key Features:

- B.S. degree program prepares students for business careers in roles such as management accountants, information managers, financial analysts and consultants.
- M.S. degree program prepares students for professional careers in public accounting and financial positions in industry and government.
- Ph.D. program prepares students for academic positions at research universities.
- Students may take courses necessary to meet requirements for professional exams such as the Certified Public Accountant (CPA), Certified Management Accountant (CMA) and Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) exams.
- Fast-track M.S. option permits undergraduate students to take six hours of graduate classes that count towards both B.S. and M.S. degrees – ideal for students planning to take the CPA exam.
- Flexible course delivery including evening classes and online classes. Graduate students may choose blend of on-campus and online learning.
- Strong emphasis on information technology. Information management concentrations in enterprise systems and information security.
- Refine students' communication, research and analytical skills to enhance decision-making and leadership abilities and instill commitment to lifelong learning.

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
