### SECTION 7.0 STUDENT SERVICES (Standard 7.0)

Student services available for mission support range from advisement to library facilities to computing facilities; each are an essential element to the preparation of students for careers in public policy and public management. These services provide both the student development mechanisms and research capabilities necessary to meet mission accomplishment in the area of professional education, service, and the advancement and creation of new knowledge.

### 7.1 Advisement and Appraisal

A. Advising System: Career guidance is provided to all students from the Program Coordinator and appropriate members of the faculty. All entering MPA students are instructed in their admission letter to meet with the MPA coordinator before registering for classes. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss degree requirements, recommended course sequences, based on the student status as being full or part-timer, and other issues relayed to the curriculum and the program. At advising meetings the coordinator discusses the core MPA course, specializations and electives and assists the students in devising a class plan. The Program Director has a reduced case load that allows for considerable time for devotion to office hours, student service and advisement. The program director is available during registration periods for student advisement. In addition, students have ready access to other members of the core faculty, who also maintain regular office hours each week for the purpose of providing advice on individual courses and related matters.

Students whose GPA falls below 3.0 are placed on academic probation. If the GPA is not raised above a 3.0 after two additional semesters on academic probation, the student is dropped from the program. The Director of Graduate Studies advises each student on academic probation with regard to work load attempted, and course selection.

- B. Financial Assistance: Financial aid is applied for and awarded at the university level and is not routinely reported to the school. Teaching and research assistantships for MPA students are uncommon. Approximately 3-6 assistantships are held by MPA students each semester. The small number of assistantships is due to two reasons. First, MPA have employment outside the university; second, the large number of Ph.D. candidates generally have precedence for assistantships.
- C. Attrition: Choosing the cohort of students that were admitted to and enrolled in the MPA program in the 1999-2000 academic year, the following table summarizes the attrition. Of the twenty four students admitted and enrolled eight students have graduated with MPA degrees, eleven students are still active in the MPA program, reflecting the part-time status of those students, three students have transferred to other graduate programs at the School of Social Sciences and two students are no longer active.

The School of Social Sciences has plans to revise the duties of support personnel in the School office to include greater emphasis being placed on job placement focus for students specifically in the School, and to facilitate coordination with placement professions in the University office as well as in the community.
