Arrival Day Resident Check-In procedures:

As noted above, we be using Capella Hall. Registration will take place in Capella Hall 1.001, a classroom on the first floor of the dorm. There will be clearly marked signs and UTD dorm staff there to greet you and point you in the right direction. **We ask that participants come in and register with the camp, get their room key, and then bring their luggage into to the dorm.** Please **DO NOT** bring your luggage into the registration room or involve it in the registration process.

After you have completed registration, you will be able to move into your dorm room. Lunch will be available for students in the cafeteria starting at noon. **Students going to lunch will meet in the RHH Common Area and be escorted to lunch by MGC staff.** We do not provide meals for family members on the day of registration. Students will be given schedules and information about orientation and where/when their lab sessions begin.

Resident Life items:
