REGULAR PROCESSING PROCTOR EXAM APPLICATION

SUBMIT AT LEAST 15 BUSINESS DAYS PRIOR TO EXAM DATE (must complete application for each exam)

- Identify approved Testing Center Site
- Submit completed Proctor Exam Application request at least 15 business days in advance of exam date

EXAMITY PROCTORING

Professor <u>must</u> have exam set up and activated within Examity.

The Testing Center has partnered with EXAMITY to meet students' testing needs. EXAMITY is a 24/7 proctoring service that allows UT Dallas students to test from anywhere in the world. The service provides live proctoring and accommodates online, hybrid, and paper exams. If the exam is set up and activated, students will see this option within Blackboard. Please ask your professor. Not all professors utilize the Examity platform, therefore this <u>may not</u> be an option.
