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SOM eLearning Team Announced

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Spring 2008 Courses and Professor Profiles

Shun-Chen Niu

Dr. Shun-Chen Niu is a Professor of Operations Management and Information Systems in the School of Management at the University of Texas at Dallas. He received a Ph.D. degree in Operations Research in 1977 from the University of California at Berkeley. He also has a Bachelor s degree in Physics in 1973 from the National Taiwan University, Taiwan.

His research interests are in the general area of stochastic models in Operations Research. He has done work in queueing theory, reliability theory, and stochastic scheduling, although queueing theory has been his primary interest. More recently, he has also conducted research on stochastic models of new-product diffusion.

Professor Niu has taught a variety of courses in the School, including Operations Research, Applied Statistics, Applied Probability and Stochastic Processes, Stochastic Models in Operations Research, Systems Simulation, and Dynamic Programming.

Here are a couple of important notes about online course registration for GMBA Online students. During early registration, online core MBA courses are only available to Global MBA Online students. All other students are placed on a waiting list until the 4th business day of regular registration. To make sure you don't miss out on getting the core courses you need, you should register by the early registration deadline if possible. If you are not able to make your payment by the early registration payment deadline, then at the latest, register by the **3rd day** of regular registration. You will be able to find the deadlines for registration and payment on the <u>Academic Calendar</u>. Also, for MBG students, when you email the course registration request, please put 'MBA Registration" in the subject line. This will allow the online graduate advisor to filter the emails and process the requests for MBG students in a timely fashion.
