Course Description

This course covers concepts useful in efficiently managing the transformation of materials, labor, and capital into products or services in process operations and supply chains. Topics covered include: the role of supply chain and operations management in the firm's overall competitive strategy, key performance measures of operational performance, and tools for improving them. The topics covered varies from long-term strategic planning to daily control of business processes.

- Articulate supply chain and operations management concepts
- Use both analytics and qualitative tools to solve typical supply chain and operations management problems

Major Exam Procedures

The UTD Testing Center will be open this semester but since online classes are allowed to use the Honorlock Proctoring system we will use it this semester. Therefore, you will take the exams and quizzes online and taken at a location of your choice. You should make a special effort to use a location with a strong internet connection and appropriate noise level.

All three major exams will be closed book, closed notes with allowed formula sheet furnished by instructor. The Assessment Quiz will be open book and notes with allowed formula sheet furnished by instructor. Students are also allowed one blank sheet of 8x11 scratch paper and a calculator or their choice. Students are not allowed to access the internet or use Excel or any MS Office application during the exam. See the Academic Calendar for the specific day and times of exams and the assessment quiz. You may begin the exam at any time during the available time interval (6:00pm-8:00pm) and still receive the full allotted time. Your instructor understands some students may not be available to take the exam during this time interval due to class conflicts or work schedules. These students should contact your instructor to arrange an alternate testing time. Your instructor prefers that you take the exams earlier rather than after the designated day and time interval. Any student who qualifies for testing accommodations will receive their extended time.

Office Hours

Office hours will be conducted using Microsoft Teams. Students are encouraged to join office hour sessions for any questions or concerns related to homework assignments, exams or any other matter they wish to discuss with the instructor. Your instructor normally does not do any presentations during office hours so just join the session if you have any questions, concerns or issues to discuss. If you have a private issue to discuss you should request a private meeting.

Grading Policy

Your professor will award + grades but not – grades at the end of the semester. For example, a student may receive a B+ or B but not a B-. Your instructor will only change a final letter grade if a calculation error occurs. Therefore, your instructor asks students to NOT request a final letter grade change (unless a calculation error has occurred) or any special consideration or additional extra credit assignments.

Homework Assignments

There will be 5 graded homework assignment using the McGraw Hill Connect System. To receive full credit you must submit the assignment on or before the due date/time. Late submissions are not allowed. Homework assignments will be automatically graded by the Connect System and your grade for the assignment will be instantaneously displayed to you. The correct solution to the assignment will become visible after the due date/time. The following are policies related to homework: 1) no time limits, 2) you may save partially completed work and return later, 3) one "check answer" is allowed for each question, 4) use of the "e-book" is allowed with no grade penalty. Any partially completed assignment will be automatically submitted for grading on the due-date/time.

Academic Dishonesty

Your instructor takes academic dishonesty very seriously. Students are required to take the Academic Integrity Quiz prior to the first exam. Students are allowed to work in small groups on homework assignments but each student must write his/her own assignment. Extra credit assignments are considered individual assignments and group work is not allowed. The Office of Academic Affairs will then contact the student(s) involved and invite them to present their perspective of the facts. The Office of Academic Affairs will then decide on whether academic dishonesty did or did not occur. If they decide academic dishonesty occurred, they will determine the consequences or sanctions. Your instructor will follow the sanctions as defined by Academic Affairs. If a student disagrees with the conclusion of Academic Affairs and/or sanctions the student may appeal and the appeal process will be initiated. If the appeal process is not completed at the time grades are due your instructor will enter a grade of NR until the appeal process is completed and will assign the final grade when the appeal process is completed.
