Course Description

Introduces technologies and tools used to realize the full potential of web sites. The course focuses on collection and use of web data such as web traffic and visitor information to design web sites that will enable firms to acquire, convert, and retain customers. Online advertising such as paid search and web analytics tools will also be included.

1. Appreciate different types of digital media and their role.
2. Understand how data drives a firm's deployment of digital media.
3. Learn data analytics techniques to analyze data generated from digital media.

Course & Instructor Policies

Adherence to instructions will be considered an important part of the grade. The professor's assessment of the grades is final.

Late work is not allowed after the deadline or via email submission. There will be assignment submission links provided on eLearning. Zero credit for not adhering to the deadlines. In case of family or medical emergency, which is beyond student's control, a medical report is required including of physician's information. This applies to attendance as well, i.e., to receive the attendance grade for day for an emergency reason, the student is required to provide a physician's note, or any document that proves emergency.

In email communication, please mention the course number in the subject line and use UT Dallas email address. The professor and TA will email as soon as possible, however sometimes responses may take up to 3 working days.
