One requirement of all students enrolled in this class is completion of two research exposure credits. This requirement provides students practical and direct experiences with research and is an important means to understanding behavioral research. Details about this requirement appear on the separate Research Exposure Credit Requirement handout distributed on the first day of class. A link to "Research Exposure Credit (REC) Requirement" is also posted on the BBS Information Center in eLearning (link on the left side).

Failure to complete the research exposure requirement will result in lowering your total grade in this class. For each Research Exposure Credit you fail to complete, your course grade will be reduced by 1/3 letter grade. For example, if you only complete one of the two required credits and your grade for all other course requirements is a B+, then your grade would be lowered from an B+ to an B. If you do not complete both credits, your grade would be lowered from an B+ to B-. The deadline for completion of these credits is found on the REC instruction sheet.

KEYS for SUCCESS in this course: This course covers a lot of content - no matter who you take for Intro, it's a LOT of chapters we all have to cover! For those of you thinking about taking the MCAT, you will be well prepared for the Psychology subsection from this course. We hit the ground running as soon as the course begins. The course is doable if you are motivated, disciplined, and organized about time. You can do it!

*Remember, I take the 4 highest exam scores out of 5. If you are happy with your 4 unit exams, you can opt out of taking the final. You can also take it with the confidence that it will be dropped if it is lower than your other 4 scores.

Engagement in this class will enrich your educational experience. It cannot be emphasized enough: **Reading the required text is essential to your success in the course.** In each unit, you will find a "greatest hits" mini-lecture that highlights the key take-aways from each chapter, but it is important that you carefully read the chapters. I have posted lecture notes and chapter study guides with key terms to help you focus on important concepts while reading. Don't skip the review questions that exist between sections in the textbook - these are excellent comprehension checks. If you cannot answer these questions, you should STOP and review the prior content before moving forward. Do the LearningCurves earnestly! (You can do them over and over again after the due date for no grade). Together, these tools are the BEST ways to check whether you have understood course content and are ready for exams. I will also be available to answer questions during in person office hours and via Microsoft Teams one-on-one or via small groups, depending on needs and interest. Please reach out to me or your TA to set up a session! You can do this by sending an email, including your name and course section. VERY IMPORTANT - You need to be checking Teams and your UTD email several times a week. There will be announcements of interest to you - maybe even time sensitive extra credit opportunities. You should download the Teams app to your phone too (all UTD students have free access to Teams). I will post a weekly check-in every Monday with a helpful infographic TO DO list too. Don't miss these!

<u>Extra credit</u>: There may be small extra credit opportunities posted in the weekly Teams messages (posted Monday mornings). This is to reward engagement with me and your classmates to encourage the use of the weekly TO DO infographic I provide to keep you on track.

<u>Civility</u>: A positive attitude is expected. Disrespect directed at anyone in our classroom community will not be tolerated in any way. Let's please aim for being our best selves during the time we have together.

Exams (4 unit exams + Final exam x 125 points each / 500 points): Only your four highest exam grades will be counted. VERY IMPORTANT!! All exams must be taken in-person at the Testing Center on the UTD Campus. Each exam will be open over several days and you can take it during any time that the testing center is open during the test availability window. Registration is required for each exam, and you must schedule your appointment at least 48 hours in advance. Please register for your exams early! If you are not able to take the exam because you did not register in time, you will not be allowed to take the exam late and it will have to be one of your dropped exams.

Exams are timed (75 minutes) and taken via elearning during the stated availability period in the course calendar above. The questions will appear one-at-a-time. You will see a combination of multiple choice, true/false, fill in the blank, and matching questions for the unit exams. The final exam will not include fill-in-the-blank questions.

If you need to take the exam off-campus, you can work with various other approved testing centers to take your exam. Please visit the <u>distance-learning page</u> to read and follow the step-by-step instructions. <u>Applications must be submitted at least 10 business days in advance</u> and late applications are not accepted. Please note that there is often a cost associated with testing at an approved site other than UTD.

Grades will be released after the availability period. Following the exam availability period, your TA will post times for you to review your exam 1:1.

NO HASSLE EXAM POLICY -- Sometimes life happens and you just can't manage to take an exam. Maybe you forgot, maybe there are more pressing concerns. Don't worry! You just need to take 4 out of the 5 exams. If you miss one, just move forward and take the remaining exams. All students need to take at least 4 out of the 5 total exams. If you take all 5 exams, the lowest score will automatically be dropped. If there are serious, extenuating circumstances that prevent you from taking a total of 4 exams (e.g. extended hospitalization, eviction), please contact me to discuss your unique circumstances and we will provide alternate arrangements such as an oral exam.

Applied Psych Reflection (50 points): Your first assignment in this course is to complete the Applied Psych Reflection found on eLearning. This assignment is designed to help you see the utility of Psychological research in your everyday life. This assignment involves watching a short video, summarizing the research findings, and answering a question prompt. Responses will be evaluated on clarity/writing (25 points) & thoroughly/effectively addressing all parts of the prompt (25 points). Submit file as pdf (preferred), docx, txt, or rtf. Applied Psych Reflection DUE SUNDAY, 9/7 by 11:59pm on eLearning. It is incredibly important that you write your paper on your own, without the use of generative AI (e.g. ChatGPT). Write simply, follow the directions, and you will be successful on this assignment. If there are red flags raised about your reflection, your work will be submitted to the Office of Conduct for official review. Please do not take shortcuts and create a headache for yourself and the teaching team.

Perusall Guided Reading assignments (13 x 20 points each / 260 points): These assignments are designed to help you more deeply engage with the course material and to foster a sense of community, connectedness, and engagement among students in the course. The assignments might ask you some targeted questions from the chapter, ask you to watch a video related to the chapter and connect to course concepts, to listen to a podcast, or to think creatively about the chapter topic. The goal is for you to relate each chapter to your own life and to reflect more deeply about what you are learning. Perusall's set up resembles social media. You will (1) click on the link to the assignment from eLearning (very important to initiate your assignment in eLearning for the grade to sync), (2) you will see a pdf from me for that week's assignment containing several opportunities for learning, (3) read the assignment's specific requirements for the number of responses that are necessary and post your responses (4) read other students' response to see their takes on the content and interact with each

other, (5) upvote your favorite comments. The Perusall system rewards deep engagement with each item and with peers, the algorithm gives you higher scores the more deeply engaged you are. Your best responses are used to calculate your grade for the assignment (and you can access feedback within Perusall for how you did). The Perusall system will break down our large class into groups of ~20, so you are always engaging with a much smaller group. Your TA will be monitoring Perusall comments as well! The assignments are always designed to generate a sense of wonder and curiosity, so I have no doubt you will have plenty to discuss amongst each other. Perusall content is covered on exams. Enjoy this interactive way to earn points in the course!

Achieve Learning Curves (30 x 5 points each / 150 points): Learning Curve assignments are completed through the textbook companion site, Achieve. 30 Learning Curve assignments (@ 5 points each) have been selected for you to reinforce your learning. These assignments are based on Mastery Learning, meaning that you only have to reach the point goal (usually 300-450 points) in order to receive full credit for the assignment. The system is calibrated to address deficits in your learning and will direct you to the place in the textbook to find the correct answer. If you miss questions, you are not penalized, you simply answer more questions until you master the concept and reach the point target. Therefore, completing the assignment means you automatically receive a 100%. Incomplete/unsubmitted assignments will receive a grade of 0. Translation: Make sure you hit the point target. For example, if the point target is 450 points, a student who earns 449 points will receive a zero. It is up to the student to make sure you have hit the point target and earned your grade for the assignment. Learning Curve assignments have due dates (SUNDAY nights @ 11:59pm). I have set the system to have a grace period for Learning Curve assignments for 24 hours past the due date. If you forget to complete Learning Curves beyond this amnesty deadline, you will receive zeros on those missed assignments. Feel free to work ahead to submit these assignments.

Research Exposure Credit: All students in the course are required to complete two research exposure credits online via the SONA system. Details will be posted on eLearning. Failure to complete two research credits will result in a grade penalty (see Final Letter Grade Determination Chart in the syllabus). You should receive an email from the SONA system about completing your SONA requirement online. Follow the instructions on how to proceed (this is a BBS requirement).

Policy on late papers / technical problems:

PLEASE do the LearningCurves well before the deadlines. For this assignment only, I have set the system to allow no penalty for LearningCurves that are submitted up to 24 hours after the Sunday night deadline. Beyond this, there are no make-up opportunities. Most students do end up forgetting a LearningCurve assignment or two. Please don't sweat it - this is a very minor part of your grade! If there are extenuating circumstances and you need an extension on a LearningCurve assignment beyond the 24 hour grace period, you may request this at least 24 hours ahead of time by contacting your TA. Translation: LearningCurves are due on Sunday nights @ 11:59pm. You don't need to get approval to take advantage of the 24 hour grace period. If you need time beyond Monday @ 11:59pm then you need to make your request before Saturday, 11:59pm. Extensions will be arranged on a case-by-case basis.

It is your responsibility to reserve your exam spots at the Testing Center EARLY. If you fail to do this ahead of time and the Testing Center cannot accommodate you, it will be your dropped exam.

Because the Perusall assignments are interactive with your peers, these should be done before the fixed due dates. If there are extenuating circumstances and you need an extension on a Perusall Guided Reading assignment, you may request this <u>at least 24 hours ahead of time</u> by contacting your TA. Extensions will be arranged on a case-by-case basis.

<u>NOTE</u>: We do not grant extensions on assignments AFTER due dates. If you are in need, be sure to reach out AT LEAST 24 hours before an assignment is due. Under most circumstances, extension requests on assignments (<u>not exams</u>) will be granted if you ask at least 24 hours prior to the deadline. If a due date has passed, the answer to an extension request will be a firm no.

Your work in this class should originate from your mind and reflect your thinking. There are two writing assignments for the course, the Applied Psych Reflection and the Final Course Reflection and 13 Perusall assignments. The two paper assignments require you to produce original and personal reflections and cite appropriately as instructed. All writing assignments for this course prohibit putting assignment prompts into Generative AI for outlines, drafts, post content, or talking points.

Generative AI is allowed for the following: creating study materials to prepare for exams.

The consequences of academic dishonesty can be severe, ranging from failing an assignment to failing the class to being on academic probation. I will not hesitate to first arrange a face-to-face meeting with you to discuss possible red flags and submit any flagged work to the Office of Student Conduct for their review. Reminder: Research Exposure Credit Requirement (REC): **FIRM DEADLINE 12/1/25** - Do not ignore emails from the SONA system!

One requirement of all students enrolled in this class is completion of two research exposure credits. Details about this requirement can be found on a separate handout distributed on the first day of class or in the BBS Information Center on eLearning. Research exposure credits must be completed by the date found on the REC instruction sheet or your course grade will be lowered. For each credit you fail to complete, your course grade will be reduced by 1/3 of a letter grade (e.g., for 2 missing credits, a B+ will become a B-).

A note on final course grades and "bump up" requests: Please note that the above determinations are firm. PLEASE do not put me in an uncomfortable position at the end of the semester by asking for a "few extra points" to bump you to the next grade so that you can graduate with honors, pass, maintain your GPA, or avoid losing your academic scholarship (all real requests I have received). I simply cannot in good faith honor these one-off requests and I appreciate you for understanding my responsibility as a UTD instructor. The best way to achieve the grade you desire is to work hard and work smart and communicate at least 24 hours BEFORE deadlines if you need extra time. Lam very happy to assist students by meeting with you in person to discuss work before due dates (plan ahead to schedule a time!).
