Course Description

Study of world financial markets and institutions, foreign exchange exposure and management, foreign direct investment, and a variety of issues involved in the financial management of multinational firms. We live in a world where most of the economic functions (consumption, production, and investment) are highly globalized. It is essential for financial managers to fully comprehend the international aspect of financial management.

Learning Outcomes

* Understand and be able to apply the concepts of exchange rate, conversion, hedging and to analyze the behavior of real markets when international conditions change.

*Understand the nature of international monetary system changes and effect on economic activities in the last 3 centuries.

*Understand the nature of international trade and investment in the modern economy.

*Students will have an overview of most areas of international finance with special attention to the impact of exchange rates on financial decisions on firm level.

*Students will also develop knowledge of and ability to use the precise language of international finance and MNC governance.

*Analyze BoP accounting and components.
