Course Description This course is designed for students who have successfully completed *the First Part of Integrated Chinese, Level One* and those who have acquired the same level of language proficiency or above. Students will continue to develop their verbal communication skills with expanding vocabulary and sentence structures to be able to function in various social settings. In reading and writing, more emphasis will be shifted from *pinyin* to authentic Chinese writing system – the characters.

Learning Outcomes Students will reinforce and expand their ability to understand spoken Chinese. Students will expand functional Chinese vocabulary and apply them in verbal communication.
Students will write 600 characters and be able to apply them in reading and writing.
