You will be required to take two essay exams (one at midterm and the other during the final exam period). You are also expected to keep current with the reading assignments, attend class regularly, and participate in class discussions.

Your paper must use at least two sources (books or scholarly articles) outside of the assigned texts. The paper will be due Nov.22, 2005. If you choose to do extra credit, the paper will be averaged as equal to one of the exams. Note: extra credit cannot hurt your grade - if your paper is not equal to, or higher than, the average of your two exams, I will not count it as part of your grade (exception—any evidence of plagiarism on your paper may result in a failing grade for the entire course).
