Course Objectives:

- To introduce you to the School of Arts & Humanities, including A&H majors, centers, and research and career opportunities
- To acquaint you with A&H advisors and present you with advising tips and guidelines
- To connect you with the UTD campus community through presentations, campus involvement, and interactions with faculty, staff, and peers.
- To present tips, tactics, and techniques for more effective learning, emphasizing critical thinking and the use of campus resources.

Course Description:

<u>ARHM 1100</u> - Freshman Seminar (1 semester hour) This course is a graduation requirement for all freshmen in the School of Arts and Humanities (A&H). Incoming freshmen will learn about the intellectual and cultural environment in the School of Arts and Humanities through lectures, group projects, activities, guest panels, and attendance at artistic and cultural events. Students will also learn about A&H majors (Art and Performance, Arts and Technology, Emerging Media and Communication, Historical

Studies, and Literary Studies), research opportunities, careers, and internships. This course is open to all non-A&H majors. Credit/No Credit. Co-requisite: <u>UNIV 1010</u>. (1-0) Y

Coursework & Grading Philosophy:

- ARHM 1100 and UNIV 1010 are required courses for all incoming freshmen as it has been effective in raising GPAs, retention from the freshman to sophomore year, and overall student satisfaction and success.
- UTD is a selective admissions institution with one of the highest average Freshman class SAT scores in the state, therefore performance and participation in ARHM & UNIV is expected to reflect the caliber of students and academic standards of the university as a whole.
- The course objectives for ARHM & UNIV represent goals which are fundamental to student success both inside and outside of the college classroom.

Grading:*

90 – 100 points = Credit (equivalent of an "A") 80- 89 points = Credit (equivalent of a "B") 70-79 points = Credit (equivalent of a "C") 60 – 69 points = Credit (equivalent of a "D") 59 points or less = No Credit (equivalent of a "F")

*ARHM 1100 and UNIV 1010 are requirements for graduation. If you drop the course or fail it, you must take Study Skills in the Spring. It will be recoded in order to give you credit for the course and enable you to replace your "F" or "W."

Assignments:

- Office Hours Visit (20%; up to 20 points) Write one paragraph that shows which professor was visited; her/his office hours; office #; and something interesting/unusual in the office. DUE 9/17 (M section) and 9/19 (W section) at the beginning of class.
- CareerWorks sign up (10%; 10 points) Will obtain names of students who sign up from Career Center. DUE 10/15 (M section) and 10/17 (W section).

- Student Success Center Visit (20%; 20 points) Will obtain names of student who sign up from the Student Success Center. **DUE 11/26 (M section) and 11/28 (W section).**
- A&H Event Attendance (10% each; 20 points total) two events required. Submit evidence of attendance such as a photo of student in attendance, ticket stub stapled to participation sheet, etc. DUE NO LATER THAN 12/10 (M section) and 12/12 (W section) at the beginning of class.
- UNIV 1010 Attendance (20%; up to 20 points) Will obtain attendance records from FYLs. *This assignment is standard across all Freshman Seminar classes.
- ARHM 1100 Quiz (10%; up to 10 points) The quiz will be based on all lectures that occurred during the term. Be sure to attend class to pass the quiz! DUE 12/10 (M section) and 12/12 (W section).
