Course Description

Teaches concepts useful in efficiently managing the logistics and distribution of a business enterprise. Topics covered include system structure design, inventory, warehousing, location decisions and transportation.

Student Learning Objectives/Outcomes

Students will develop an understanding of functions and attributes of logistics. Upon completion of the course, students will also be able to:

- Evaluate logistics systems to identify strengths and weaknesses
- Discuss challenges in a wide range of logistics settings
- Apply contemporary concepts in design and operations of logistics systems

We will use Microsoft Excel occasionally to analyze various logistics systems, so all students are required to have access to a computer with Microsoft Excel.
