Course Description	This course continues to emphasize spoken Chinese for students to gain listening comprehension and verbal communication skills with more extensive vocabulary and sentence patterns. Meanwhile, students will continue to learn high-frequency characters in areas of immediate needs and bring the total number of characters to around 450. They will be able to identify these characters and use them in simple, meaningful sentences. Class will be conducted in vocabulary learning, pattern drills, dialogue practice, role-plays and group projects.	
Learning Outcomes	Students will demonstrate the ability to understand simple conversational Chinese and construct their own dialogues in given situation. Students will write 400 characters and be able to read them in meaningful context. Students will analyze basic grammatical structures and apply them in speech and sentence writing.
