- To introduce you to the mission statement and goals associated with UT Dallas and the School of Interdisciplinary Studies, including majors, research and career opportunities.
- To connect you with the UT Dallas campus community through presentations, campus involvement, and interactions with faculty, staff and peers.
- Integrate academically and socially into the Interdisciplinary Studies community.
- Maintain mutually supportive relationships with freshman classmates, academic advisors, and instructors.
- Understand the importance of critical thinking and writing skills for academic success.
