Exams

You may open book to answer those questions, but the better way to do it is to study before you take it, given the time restriction. Your lowest quiz grade will be dropped. Because of this, **No** late quizzes will be accepted and there will be **No** opportunities to make-up quizzes.

Readings and Exercises

You should pay attention to the readings and exercises stated in the schedule at the end. They define what is going to be covered in the class and what to expect on the exam. The assigned exercises will ensure your study in the right direction and help you assess your understanding of the material. The solutions to the exercises will be posted on eLearning for you to check your answer. To succeed in the closed book and closed notes exam, please try to work out the questions on your own before you look up the solutions and don't take them lightly.

Term Project
