Organization = "The University of Texas at Dallas" Language = Spanish, French, or German Email = your UTD email address 3. Pay for the exam. The cost of the exam is \$10.00 for one test attempt. You may pay using a debit or credit card. 4. You will receive an email confirmation of your purchase with the link and exam ID (password). You do not have to take the exam immediately after registering, but you must take the exam before you can enroll. 5. Take the exam. When you begin the exam, you may not stop and go back. Make sure you have uninterrupted access to the Internet for a period of about an hour. 6. Print your results (score and course placement). Students must enroll in the highest level course available as determined by their placement score. Instructors reserve the right to require additional coursework for those students who fail to enroll in a course at the appropriate level. 7. You will need to give

your advisor a copy (print out or digital version) to enroll in the course. You are also required to bring a copy of your results to your instructor on the first day of class. *You need not take the exam if prior courses and/or credit by exam scores satisfy SPAN, FREN, or GERM course prerequisites (this includes credit through courses at UT Dallas, transfer credit, and AP or CLEP credit).

Intermediate Spanish II (3 semester credit hours) This course is a continuation of Intermediate Spanish I.

Understand that students enter the Intermediate Spanish course at different levels, SPAN 2312 wich uses the following text book "Atando cabos" brings students to a common proficiency level and "ties up the loose ends" from their first year of Spanish. Focusing on the significance of culture and interpersonal communication in learning a foreign language, this text is comprised of high-interest, relevant themes that motivate critical thinking and classroom discussions.
