In an innovative and engaging approach to the teaching of translation studies, the translation workshop in the fall of 2016 will be the first of its kind in the history of the School of Arts and Humanities (A&H). The original conceptual frame of A&H was to develop an interdisciplinary program. To respond to this mission, we will be offering a hybrid-online course that moves between the translation of verbal texts to the translation of visual, filmic, musical, and digital works. Several associative modules will be dedicated to the translation and interpretation of various literary and artistic works. Therefore, the seminar will also rely on the students' particular creative and academic backgrounds. The workshop will be an exciting forum to chart new landscapes and show how translation revitalizes the interpretation and interaction of works of art and literature.
