Course Description

An introduction to business financial reporting designed to create an awareness of the accounting concepts and principles for preparing the three basic financial statements: the income statement, balance sheet, and statement of cash flows. The course is designed to benefit all business students who will be future users of accounting information.

Learning Objectives

1. How businesses meet the information needs of investors and creditors
2. How businesses operate and how accounting serves them
3. The elements of, the relationships among, and the accounting concepts underlying the primary financial statements
4. How business transactions are input, processed by an accounting information system, and output by that same system to produce financial statements
5. The uses and limitations of financial statements and related information for making business decisions

Exams (3 Exams: 80% of final grade)

There will be three exams in this course. Exams will be in-class, closed book and closed notes. Exam 1 and Exam 2 are non-cumulative. Final Exam is cumulative, as required by the new departmental policy. The exams are designed to test your understanding of the basic accounting concepts. They will consist of calculations and theory questions. Concepts from lecture presentation, homework and quizzes will be included on the exam. Programmable calculators are not allowed during exams. Students are required to bring **4-function calculator** to each exam. You are not permitted to use any electronic communications devices during the exam. This explicitly includes cell phones and pagers. You are also not permitted to use a portable computer on the exam. You are strongly urged to leave any electronic devices (except calculators) at home or in a locker on the day of the exam. All students are required to present proof of identification at the time of the exam. Acceptable documentation must include picture identification such as an official UTD Comet Card, Passport, or State approved driver's license.

Exam Make-up Policy

Students **MUST** take all exams. Students missing an exam should contact me in writing (acknowledged email message is also acceptable) prior to the date of the absence, and provide appropriate documentation for the excused absence. In cases where advanced notification is not feasible (e.g., accident or emergency) the student must provide notification by the end of the second working day after the absence, including a reason for why notice could not be sent

prior to the class. Failure to take the make-up exam at the agreed time and place will result in a grade of zero. Make-up exams will be different from the exam given in class. The level of the difficulty of the makeup exam may not be comparable to the exam given at the scheduled time.

Quizzes (Best 5 out of 6; 15% of final grade)

There will be 6 take-home quizzes throughout the course (2 quizzes before each Exam). *These quizzes are used to reinforce the skills necessary to do well on exams.* You may work together on the quizzes, but you must complete your own quiz. *Your lowest quiz grade will be dropped.* Because of this, NO late quizzes will be accepted and there will be NO opportunities to make-up quizzes.

Class Participation (5% of final grade)

Class participation counts toward 5% of your final grade. It is important to come to class prepared, so you are expected to 1) arrive on time for class; 2) have read the corresponding chapters and other course materials posted on eLearning; 3) have completed the homework. As a courtesy to others, please turn off your cellular phones while in the classroom.

Homework

In addition to the graded quizzes, there are also recommended problems to work out of your textbook. Some of the suggested problems will be illustrated in class. These homework problems are not graded. But they are designed to help you better understand the course materials and perform well on the exams and quizzes. Solutions to the recommended problems will be posted on the eLearning website.
