Course Description: This course is an introductory course intended for students with little or no knowledge of the language. Its aim is to develop the linguistic and cultural knowledge and skills necessary for basic comprehension, communication and interaction in both spoken and written language. It aims to equip students with effective learning strategies and to provide a creative, encouraging environment for students to practice these skills.

- Talk about past events
- Describe the location of objects
