Course Description

Introduction to statistical and probabilistic methods and theory applicable to situations faced by managers. Topics include: data presentation and summarization, regression analysis, fundamental probability theory and random variables, introductory decision analysis, estimation, confidence intervals, hypothesis testing, and simple ANOVA. Microsoft EXCEL will be used heavily and bringing a laptop to class is encouraged.

Students are expected to master the materials and demonstrate this mastery through homework assignments and scheduled exams.
