Course Description This course is a graduation requirement for the University and for the School of Interdisciplinary Studies. Students will learn about the intellectual and cultural environment of the University and the School of Interdisciplinary Studies. Students will also learn about IS majors, careers, internships, clubs, and organizations while developing academic and interpersonal skills

Learning Outcomes

- 1) Students will be introduced to the UT Dallas campus community and the School of Interdisciplinary Studies, and will become integrated into the UTD and IS communities both academically and socially.
- 2) Students will develop skills of social responsibility, including intercultural competence and civic responsibility.
- 3) Student will develop skills of personal responsibility, connecting choices and actions to ethical decision-making.
- 4) Students will learn the importance of critical thinking and writing skills for academic success.
- 5) Students will examine their own skills and reflect on the relationships between those skills and their ability to succeed.

Presentation: In groups of five, students will make a five-minute video presentation about their majors or about an aspect of life at UTD. Your video will be assessed for a grade and will also be reviewed at some future date to generate assessment numbers and possibly to review trends regarding the prevalence of various skills, issues, and ideas at UTD. Field activities: Alone or in groups, you will pursue field activities and submit reports regarding those activities. A student organization visit is required, as is a financial planning activity and a visit to your adviser's office. Other activities will be at your discretion. More details will be provided on the relevant assignment sheet.

Career statement & resume: You will develop a resume and will also write a short essay (2 pp.) or a career you are interested in pursuing. In your essay, you will consider pros and cons of this career, as well as the preparation that is required of practitioners. More details will be provided on the relevant assignment sheet.
