General Course Information

Course Description	In this course, we will explore artistic, philosophical, social, historical, and psychological dimensions of the theatrical experience through reading, writing, discussion, performance, and viewing.
Learning Outcomes	 Students will learn to interpret theatrical performances and texts as demonstrated in written analysis papers and in-class performances. (CT) Students will communicate their ideas effectively through written and oral assignments. (COM) Students will demonstrate an ability to work with others toward a shared goal through the group assignment. (TW) Students will analyze the cultural context of at least one dramatic work in one of the written assignments. (SR)
